## **Egg Drop Experiment**

Physics student teams were asked to use their creativity, intelligence, artistic, and inquisitive natures to develop a container that would protect a raw egg from cracking when dropped from 15 feet above (see pictures). Teams had size limits for their containers. The design and artistic appeal were also rated. The term "SOFT" seemed important to all teams.

In the end, 4 teams were successful with a wide variety of designs. Two eggs cracked when their containers did not cooperate and landed on a side that was not protected as well as the bottom. Overall, the experiment was a lot of fun and a good learning experience at the same time.
